

Competent Person Register

In terms of Act XXVII of 2000, OHSA keeps a register of persons competent to give advice on matters related to occupational health and safety.

For a person's name to be entered into the register, an applicant needs to provide evidence of the following minimum requirements to OHSA:

- Possession of an academic qualification obtained at least two years prior to the application. As a minimum, a person should be in possession of a Diploma in Occupational Health and Safety awarded by the University of Malta or by the Malta College of Arts, Science and Technology, or an equivalent qualification certified by MQRIC to be at level 5 (min 60 ECTS) or higher in the subject.
- ii. Experience and competence in the field and
- iii. Continued professional development since obtaining the qualification.

The register only contains names of individual persons who have provided evidence of the above-mentioned requirements.

Applicants are required to include a duly certified copy of the original qualification, an equivalence certificate of qualification (if applicable), an updated CV and copies of two risk assessment reports which the applicant would have carried out in the two years prior to the application.

Every person thus registered has the option of providing his/her contact details, which will be included in the register, published on the Authority's website, against an administrative fee of €60, to be paid annually.
